

 Artificial representation of a real world process to achieve educational goals through experiential learning.

Why Classroom Simulations?

- Deep learning by doing.
- Engaged students understanding and refining their own thought processes. Emotional responses
- Incentives drive participation

- Soft skills development in working with a team communication – flexibility – grit – problem solving – critical thinking

What is Big Sky Biz Sim?

- Leading business program in Montana for teaching business concepts.
- Implemented in 2000, over 24,000 students and 120 schools have participated.
- Cash prizes for winning teams

BSBS Scenario

- Management team recently purchased a company that manufactures widgets.
- Company sells to wholesalers, distributors and major stores.
- Program runs for 8 weeks, each week is a quarter

BSBS Goals

- Maximize revenue, minimize expenses, and increase profits.
- Obtain the highest stock price value, return on equity.
 - Based on: total profits, profit trends, return on sales, stock price and dividends, and good corporate citizen decisions.
- Learn teamwork, decision-making skills, basic financial statements and business principles.

What is SMG Worldwide?

- An educational program that stimulates learning about economics, finance, and the American economic system.
- Interactive
- Interdisciplinary
- Exciting
- Motivational and Flexible

How does it work?

- Simulation 10 weeks
- Fall and Spring semesters
- Teams of 3-5 students
- Invest hypothetical \$100,000
- Simulation is entirely online. Students conduct research, enter trades, conduct portfolio analysis, etc.
- Compete for prizes


