Meeting Agenda/Minutes

The meeting was called to order at 1:03 p.m. Directors introduced themselves and a quorum was established.

Bruce Brensdal made a motion to approve the minutes and Summer Red seconded. Motion carried with no changes the minutes were approved.

Treasurer's Report

Bruce gave an update on the current finances. The unrestricted balance is \$28,453.60 of which \$7,562.85 is in checking. CD plus interest balance is \$20,431.75. There are not any current expenses.

Chris mentioned that he will be sending out calendar invoices and the 2022 MFEC Conference sponsorship requests at the same time for ease of payments. All the months for calendar have been sponsored but printing costs have increased by \$1,000 to approximately \$3,700 for 2022.

General business

Chris brought forth a new board member for consideration which is a voting item on the agenda.

Gayla Randel is from OPI. She is new to Montana and has worked part-time for the Office of Public Instruction in the past. She has a family consumer sciences education degree and has taught financial literacy classes. She was the state administrator in Kansas for financial literacy and worked on annual training for teachers. Gayla has also put together a document of resources and offered alignment to a document for multiple languages and grade levels k-12. Chris made a motion to vote to add to board and Sean second motion and motion passed.

There are still vacancies with the resignation of Chuck and Marcus Meyer but we are waiting for a replacement to fill this spot from Consumer Protection office. In addition, Michael Hagenlock left Adult Protective Services so looking for someone to fill his spot. Jennell said she has a contact that she has reached out to see if they can join the board. We will invite them to join the next MFEC meeting and the February conference prior to joining if they want to get a sense of what we do.

Laura Bolstad is retiring at end of year but has a replacement, Rosalie Kiernan, at first of year that we can add. We can have them also join the next board meeting and conference to get exposure to what we are doing.

Chris will be attending call for the State Coalition Leaders Call on 12/9/21 and will pass along anything noteworthy from the call via email to MFEC group. Will reach out to sponsored teachers to see if they want to join next meeting to give update on conference.

2022 proposed meeting dates are February 22, June 7, September 13, and December 6. Chris asked for any changes to the meeting dates if needed. Typically, the 2022 Governor's Conference on Aging tends to conflict with our September meeting, so we need to find out the date. Will leave proposed date and adjust our meeting if needed for September. Place holder invites will be sent out soon to group. Looking forward to having in person meetings at some point in 2022.

2022 MFEC Conference (February 23, 2022 Helena Delta Colonial)

Joel provided an update on current conference plans. As mentioned, the sponsorship form will be sent out to everyone with calendar invoices. Please contact Bruce if have questions on the form.

Sean Spruce from Owesta and Paul Greenwood are the keynote speakers. We will have two separate keynote sessions and then a panel with them both. Request for proposals to be ready next week and will be put on website for availability with due date December 17. We have 9 session slots, and one is currently earmarked for Native American Homeownership with Tonya and Diana Holshue. This leaves us needing 8 topics to fill the sessions. We plan to handle registration through Eventbrite this year. Offering free registration for teachers and a fee of \$75 for other attendees. Typical attendance has been around 100 people at past conferences. Will have save the date to go out in about 1 week and then can share with contacts. Board members please spread word on conference with save the date information.

Plans for conference at this time are to be an in-person conference at Delta Hotel in Helena and are working with tech person to ensure we can have a virtual presence. There is an option to use zoom for breakout sessions for people that couldn't travel to attend especially teachers who are not able to attend. We will discuss this at next conference committee meeting. Also, we will record sessions for posting after conference.

Elder Fraud and Financial Exploitation Prevention Committee Update

Currently have vacancies on committee and working to fill those. The legal documents clinic is still happening and still planning to do in-person breakout conference type events but will discuss more at upcoming committee meetings.

Native American Committee Update

Tonya talked about still wanting to do something in schools, but it has been difficult to find out what to present and there is not much access to schools currently because of the COVID challenges. She is looking for ways the committee can approach mission work to establish a native homeownership coalition. Will start meeting again in January 2022.

K-12 Committee Update

Still need to have chair for this committee so no meetings have taken place and need to have the committee chair filled. Will wait until new OPI representative (Gayla Randel) is settled on MFEC to make decisions. Gayla indicated she would like to work with a co-chair to get started and learn more about the committee. Chris will do a follow-up with MFEC members to see if anyone is interested in being the co-chair.

Discussed idea of smaller mini grants to allow teachers to obtain financial literacy materials for class. Can be in the \$50ish range and ask teachers submit a write up.

Chris will arrange a meeting of K-12 committee to get it started again.

Outreach Committee Update

MFEC calendars are expected to be delivered around the end of December. Chris will let everyone know when they are available for delivery. Have been doing some web updates with

Monica so let Chris know if there are any content changes that need to be made for other committees.

OPI has several June professional development opportunities coming up week of 13th and family consumer science training is in the planning stages.

~AI

AARP still has a radio show on Friday - Voices of Montana. Has around 224,000 listeners and discuss topics with topic industry experts. Have had guests from the FBI and a professor from the University of North Dakota on his elder abuse paper in Indian country.

Al went to Browning with Sean Spruce and did a workshop at a high school. Currently doing a lot of virtual presentations and waiting to see if January 3 works to start in person events again possibly. All is retired and now a volunteer so waiting to see process for in-person presentations. Plan is to go to communities with moderate or low covid numbers at the time.

Al reviewed 71 essays on Honoring Leaders from 6 tribal colleges and now in the process of giving out multiple \$1,000, \$750, and \$500 scholarships to the winners.





Q2 - How satisfied were you with the event? (1 mostly dissatisfied - 5 mostly satisfied)







Meeting Agenda/Minutes

The meeting was called to order at 1:05 p.m. Directors introduced themselves and a quorum was established.

Jennell Huff made a motion to approve the minutes and Karissa Trujillo seconded. Motion carried with no changes the minutes were approved.

Treasurer's Report

Bruce gave an update on the current finances. The unrestricted balance is \$16,847.85 of which is \$7,562.85 in checking. CD plus interest balance is \$20,431.75. There are not any current expenses. It was noted that the 2022 Calendar sales made \$3,500 and the 2022 MFEC Conference including sponsorships brought in \$8,500.

General business

Chris brought forth new board members for consideration which is a voting item on the agenda.

Rosie Kiernan is from NeighborWorks and is the homeownership director. She has been at the company for 8 years and previous responsibilities include homeownership planning.

Jacob Griffith is from the Montana Office of the Attorney General, DOJ, OCP. He worked in the Consumer Protection Office in the Compliance unit of investigators. Was in private practice in Oregon and then moved back to Helena.

Trevor Tangen is from DPHHS, APS and is the Bureau Chief of DPHHs. Was a APS program manager and prior to that, an investigator. Worked for the Helena police and was in the Navy for 16 years.

Summer made a motion to add new members to board and Bruce second motion and motion passed.

Other discussion regarding the bylaws noted that they provide room to have up to 25 members, so we have room for growth. If anyone has ideas of additional members, please let Chris know.

Trevor noted that the new Elder Justice Prosecutor at DOJ, Mike Fanning is a candidate for the MFEC board and is interested. Chris asked Jacob to reach out to Mike Fanning about joining MFEC.

Brittani asked Chris about the geographic representation of the board and if there are gaps across the state. Will look at it for next meeting to discuss. Also, Chris will add city and town to membership list to keep geographic updates easily available.

Officer Elections will be held during June 7th Board meeting since we are planning on meeting in person. Chris looking for someone as replacement as president since has been in this role for 5 years as well as candidates for other leadership roles.

Bruce will stay as treasurer but if anyone is interested to take on role let him know. Chris and Bruce are not leaving MFEC but looking for others to take on the officers' positions. Need to keep the committee dynamic and have succession planning in place so looking for others that are interested in these leadership opportunities. MFEC has had success not having gaps in leadership and retaining board members and that has helped keep our local group successful.

Jennell indicated she would be interested in the president position and has been encouraged by her management to take that role on. This will open the Vice President position.

Rhonda willing to continue as member of MFEC and has Minneapolis management support of being on committee but would be happy to have someone else take on role of secretary for additional growth opportunities.

Jump\$tart Update - Chris said that the state coalition leader meeting has been moved from April to August or September. They are doing quarterly coalition meetings and the next one April 6. Chris will be attending this meeting and will notify MFEC by email of any pertinent details.

MFEC Mini-Grants – Applications open until April 15th. Chris sending out email to MFEC members to share grant opportunities but can push back deadline if needed. A subcommittee will be put together to review grants and decide on awards. Will discuss at June meeting.

Other Business (Outreach Committee) included discussion on the 2022 MFEC Conference Wrap-Up. Conference surveys that were received are included in meeting packet. The virtual format worked well and appreciate the work done by the conference committee to pull it together and speakers did a great job. With this experience we know now that a virtual hybrid event is an option and will work for attendees who are not able to travel for future conferences.

Also, it is noted that if they're any topics that come up that we want to share with educators and general public we could use the virtual option to share across Montana. Could do this quarterly and could have micro speaker events.

Outreach with OPI will solicit input for topic ideas, appreciate hearing from subject matter experts to share with students or others. Educator theme calls is an idea and can have an expert present. We could record and have a library of topics on website as a resource. Summer said she could do a webinar a year to add to topics. We could use breakouts during conference to solicit topics for virtual call format as well.

Chris asked all the MFEC committees if holding a meeting prior to June meeting to discuss this to see if there is a topic or speaker that we would want to present.

Should use a Marketing strategy to put together small blurbs on event with information so it can be shared and a good way to advertise MFEC with topics. MFEC has Facebook, Twitter and a website. Monica does the updates on social media feeds and if anyone has anything to add please let Chris know. She can work on a template for committees to use for advertising events going forward.

Also, another idea mentioned is to build a contact database to market for these events. Can have different lists to gear specific topics and programs to groups and target audiences with a focus on educators, Native American homeownership, or elder fraud groups.

Elder Fraud and Financial Exploitation Prevention Committee Update

Have not meet recently as a committee. The plan is to meet with group in next two months prior to June meeting. Recruiting members and going to talk to Marsha Goetting about finding a person from Alzheimer's Association to be added to committee.

Native American Committee Update

Tonya talked about the February Montana Native American Homeownership Coalition event. It was very successful with attendees from across Montana that are involved in financial literacy. Working on revamping "Your Money Your Goals" Native American toolkit and how to make it better. It needs to be enhanced with more tools and the curriculum is well rounded but light. Tonya asked committee for feedback on the toolkit. Speaks to growth in native communities and not with focus on only hardship but also on abundance. Will send in summary of suggestions from NAC on this toolkit.

K-12 Committee Update

The Chair vacancy is not filled yet however Gayla from OPI is interested in being a co-chair. Chris will reach out to Gayla and committee to find additional leadership and need to recruit more members (can look for members from educational sector). An idea was brought up to have a quarterly topic which included subjects like focus on retirement for education and how they can maximize their retirement. Brittani will talk to others about joining committee.

Meeting Agenda/Minutes

The meeting was called to order at 1:07 p.m. Directors introduced themselves and a quorum was established. Lianna made a motion to approve the minutes and Jacob seconded. Motion carried with no changes the minutes were approved.

Treasurer's Report

Bruce gave an update on the current finances. The unrestricted balance is \$31,829.36 of which is \$11,378.91 in checking. CD plus interest balance is \$20,450.45. There are not any current expenses.

General business

We currently have 19 members on the roster but still have openings because we can host a committee up to 25 members. We are asking for suggestions for organizations and/or

members to add to MFEC. One suggestion is the Montana Credit Union Network. They have new leadership and will have a new CEO to engage with on partnering with MFEC.

The group is minus representative from State Auditor's office as well. We should reach out to their office and find a representative. Jennell said that Mark Matiolli has mentioned looking to get into the outreach space so might be interested in joining MFEC.

If anyone has names, please share with Jennell and the executive team can discuss member possibilities before the next meeting.

MFEC presented scholarships to the national Jump\$tart conference and Steve Klimkiewicz from Hellgate HS and Jeanette Barreto from Billings Senior HS have been selected to attend conference.

Sean Thomas will be attending on behalf of MFEC and gathering ways to build programming to boost ability to reach people to be an organization that people know. One idea mentioned is book readings in schools. This is an easy thing to implement by partnering with community members and read financial literacy-based books to students.

Dax and Gayla provided and update on the status of Montana Board of Education Financial Education requirements for high schools and the discussion by the legislature of adding a half credit to graduate. Working to create a task force to review what will be required if that proposal passes. Task force would be comprised of teachers and putting together what resources they have used to teach the curriculum. It has become a responsibility of OPI to determine how to work around it and just started conversations. Discussion at some level about this is something that schools are already doing and how would it be embraced and what cost are associated around the rollout timeframe. What would the impacts be in 2024-2025-2026 if it passed in this current session?

Dax said that there are multiple steps to the process being implemented in schools in Montana. MCEE met in July and were briefed on efforts that are underway. MCEE created a new committee with Chris Romano to address support and 3 main priorities. First priority is what resources exist to help the teaches, this will be driven by an OPI taskforce and superintendent with a private sector group formed to provide influence. Secondly, if this becomes a requirement, ensure that schools are communicated with and know and use MCEE network to share information like a public campaign to highlight available resources. Lastly, provide teachers with professional development in this area so they are prepared to teach curriculum in school.

There is a survey of offerings and are finding that schools are already offering content under that umbrella but don't know yet exactly what components are covered. Next step to find out what those are how they are delivered. This will be directed by legislature vs driven by OPI, but OPI will still be involved in implementation part.

Sean said that a question for MFEC is how we can support teachers in this? He would like to discuss how we can position ourselves as a more prominent clearinghouse of resources. This is a primary role that other coalitions play for their teachers. This was a major point of discussion at the state coalition meeting and approximately 14 states also have pending legislation. Dax added that there is a lot of flexibility in financial literacy and the MCEE board has concerns to ensure that fundamentals of economics are also included not just financial literacy.

Annual training/workshop can be developed with a general theme and set dates for them. They will be built around results/discussions of legislature work and it is not too early to plan a date to be ahead of game for teachers. Timing can be adjusted after final decisions are made.

Conference committee is seeking a cochair and the financial education requirements could be the theme of next conference and we can provide information on what the changes are and what trainings are available. There was discussion about looking at the reoccurrence of our conference and maybe considering a shorter time frame, i.e., 1 day every year vs longer event held every two years.

Jennell talked to Joel about changes to frequency of conference. Sean volunteered to cochair committee

December meeting date is moved to December Tuesday 13th and planning on possibly meeting in person and include hybrid virtual for attendance. The group agreed to change and decided it will be a virtual meeting.

Virtual hybrid/in person meeting is planned for March. Looking for Ideas for meeting locations: Bank of the Rockies, Federal Reserve Bank and Banking Commission offices were mentioned as possibilities.

Native American Committee Update

Tonya was not able to attend the meeting, no update provided.

Elder Fraud Committee Update

Jennell said their group had a virtual meeting and have some new members. Talked about mission statement for committee and had a brainstorming session and forward planning. 2023 ideas include Governors' Conference on Aging and having a traveling roadshow. Members in group have educational opportunities and will have committee members team up to present. Group is part of the national elder justice coalitions. Lori Hamm and Tyler offered to join national calls to represent the committee.

K-12 Committee Update

We need to identify purpose of committee and what to work on. Sean has new ideas for committee including the classroom book readings and hosting a monthly teacher

think/pair/share event. Sean said he will cochair the K-12 committee with Gayla. Can work on planning something for April for teachers, this could be a target event for the committee to work on. Define support of teachers and students and how to support parents as well so they can help students. Examples can include how to start a saving program and what is what is a 529 savings plan. We could also include grandparents and adults going back to school.

MFEC should have a representative at the MCEE summer teacher training to address group about what we do and what resources are available to them.

Outreach Committee Update

Needing artwork for 2023 calendars. Asked if First Interstate sponsored the piggy bank contest again this year. Brittani indicated that they had held the contest and that she can get 13 pictures of piggy banks and will send to Jennell and Chris to look at to use in the calendar.
